

ROUND 1 INTERVIEW: MI JUNG HUR
Saturday, June 27, 2015



Q. Got to feel pretty good about that round. I know you wanted the last putt though bad, didn't you?

MI JUNG HUR: I left four holes yesterday but I should play -- I mean, I should finish it. But past it past, so I just keep focus on my game, second round.

Q. Did you see this coming?

MI JUNG HUR: What is it?

Q. Did you see this coming, 8-under par? Did you feel like --

MI JUNG HUR: No.

Q. No?

MI JUNG HUR: I just tried to focus every shot, every putt and it works yesterday.

Q. What happened on the last putt?

MI JUNG HUR: I don't know. I had a lot of birdie chance today, last two holes, but I missed it like edge of the hole. It was close but it didn't, so late afternoon.

Q. How's your game been since the win in Alabama?

MI JUNG HUR: After that my shot is definitely better, way better than like last few years ago, but I was struggling with my putting a few tournaments. My putting works good on this putting green in Arkansas, so I look forward to play Saturday and Sunday.

Q. Why is that? Why do you like the greens?

MI JUNG HUR: Is it bentgrass?

Q. I don't know.

MI JUNG HUR: I like that grass. I like this putting here. Nice condition every year.

Q. How do you deal with the quick turnaround having to go tee it up in an hour or so?

MI JUNG HUR: I will just take a rest, hit maybe 10 balls and 10 putts to the second round.

Q. What's the plan for the next round?

MI JUNG HUR: The same. Every shot, I focus on every shot. Didn't think about anything during my shot, it will be -- it will give me good results.

Q. I know you said you like the greens here. Have you played well here before?

MI JUNG HUR: Actually it was my rookie year, second, but I made four straight bogeys on final and then dropped to 11. That was my best finish I think. But every year I made top 20, so I feel good about it.
